FOR RADIOGRAPHERS

Own your remote radiology practice.

Direct matches, session-based work, and credentials you control — on a platform built around how radiographers actually work.

This document introduces Remote-I for radiographers — how matching works, what the platform gives you, and a walkthrough of the dashboard you'll use on every session.

DIRECT

No agency middleman

Work direct with hospitals. Keep the agency margin.

SESSIONS

Paid for scanning time

Session-based, not day-rate. No wasted downtime.

CPD

Auto-logged HCPC hours

Every completed session added to your CPD record.

THE PROBLEM

Locum radiography is working for everyone — except the radiographer

If you've worked remote or locum sessions, you already know the pattern. An agency blasts a group chat, the first person to reply gets the shift, and what you actually do on the day is a lottery — the modality might not match your strengths, the scanner might be unfamiliar, and half the booked day might be wasted waiting for a fault to clear. Meanwhile your CPD record lives in a notebook, your credentials live in an agency's filing system, and the margin on your hourly rate lives with the agency too.

The problem is structural. Agencies optimise for filling any slot with any body. Remote-I exists to change that.

What's wrong with the current process

1

Group-chat lottery

First radiographer to reply wins the slot. No weight given to modality fit, scanner familiarity, or prior experience.

2

Day-rate exposure

You're paid to be present, not paid for scans completed. Scanner goes down — you're still there, but the rate gets renegotiated downwards.

3

Agency controls your credentials

Your HCPC certificate, DBS, and insurance sit in someone else's system. You can't move them easily and you don't see when they're shared.

4

CPD is a manual afterthought

Every completed session is a CPD activity you should be logging — but nobody does it on the day, and the HCPC audit finds you six months later.

5

No portable track record

Two years of excellent remote work means nothing when you move to a new agency. You start from zero every time.

THE SOLUTION

A platform that treats you like a professional, not a slot-filler

Remote-I matches you to remote radiology sessions directly with the hospital, based on a fit score that accounts for modality, scanner manufacturer and model, certification, and your actual track record on the platform. No agency in the middle, no group-chat scramble, no flat day-rate for waiting around.

"Your availability, your rate, your credentials, your CPD record — all in one place, and all owned by you. The hospital gets a scored, auditable match. You get a transparent process and a portable record of the work."

How it works for you

Sessions that actually match you

Every open session runs through a six-factor fit score: availability (40 pts), modality match (25 pts), required certification (15 pts), hospital rating (10 pts), scanner manufacturer experience (5 pts), and scanner model experience (5 pts). Top three matches get notified first. If you're the best fit, you hear about it before anyone else.

Paid per session, not per day

Sessions are posted for specific time slots when the scanner is confirmed running. You get paid for the session you complete — not for showing up to a day-rate that gets disputed when the scanner faults. The hospital pays for scanning time; you get paid for scanning time.

Credentials you carry with you

Your HCPC (or SRK, CORU, equivalent) registration, background check, and professional indemnity insurance sit in your own profile. You control who sees them and when. Expiry dates are tracked automatically and you're reminded before they lapse — not after the hospital flags it.

CPD that writes itself

Every completed session is auto-logged as a remote scanning CPD activity, with hours calculated from actual start/end times, modality recorded, and scanner details captured. Add courses and self-study manually. HCPC 30-hour cycle progress visible at a glance. When the audit comes, the record is already built.

HOW MATCHING WORKS

Why you're at the top of the match list — or why you aren't

When a hospital posts a session, Remote-I scores every radiographer in their approved pool against six weighted factors. The score adds up to 100 and determines the order you appear in the match list. Higher score means you get notified earlier, often before the session even opens to the wider pool.

The six factors scored against your profile

FACTOR	MAX PTS	WHAT IT MEANS FOR YOU
Availability	40	Your availability block covers the session window. Keeping availability current is the single biggest lever.
Modality match	25	MRI, CT, PET-CT, PET-MRI — listed on your profile and matched to what the session requires.
Certification	15	Required certifications for the session (e.g. cardiac MRI, PET-CT oncology) present and in-date on your profile.
Hospital rating	10	Your average rating from previous sessions at this hospital. Higher ratings stick.
Scanner manufacturer	5	Prior experience with the manufacturer (Siemens, GE, Philips, Canon) recorded on your profile.
Scanner model	5	Specific scanner model experience — counts even more for complex PET-MRI and hybrid systems.

Your profile completeness score (shown at the top of your dashboard) summarises how well you stack up against these factors overall. Every missing field costs you fit points on matched sessions — so a 95% profile gets notified noticeably earlier than a 60% one.

What happens when you're matched

Top 3 matches notified first

If your fit score is in the top three for a session, you receive the notification before the session opens more widely. Respond quickly and the slot is yours to accept.

Compliance is frozen on accept

The moment you accept, your credential status is locked into the audit record. No surprise compliance questions a month later.

THE RADIOGRAPHER DASHBOARD

Everything you need for your remote practice, in one place

The dashboard is organised into two sections: **Sessions** covers the live flow of work from incoming requests to completed history, and **Tools** covers the ongoing practice admin — availability, hours worked, protocols, and CPD. The landing page shows a live profile-completeness bar, four headline metrics, and your pending requests queue.

Dashboard navigation structure

	Calendar	Your sessions across a rolling calendar view — past, current, and upcoming, colour-coded by modality.

TOOLS	Availability	Set availability blocks. Shown to hospitals during matching. The single biggest factor in your fit score.

	CPD Log	Auto-populated from completed sessions. HCPC cycle progress tracker. Manual entries for courses and self-study.
	Protocol Library	Browse and contribute protocol notes shared across the radiographer community.
	My Profile	Credentials, modalities, scanner experience, and registration body. Directly drives your fit score.

The CPD Log row (highlighted) is the feature most radiographers rediscover weeks in — it's already captured everything quietly in the background.

THE SESSION FLOW

From invitation to completion — in your hands

Sessions move through four clear states: new request, accepted, in progress, and completed. Every state has its own tab on the dashboard, its own actions, and its own audit-log entry.

What happens at each stage

STAGE	WHAT YOU DO	WHAT THE PLATFORM DOES
New Request	Review session details, scanner, timing. Accept or decline.	Freezes your compliance status on accept. Notifies the hospital.
Active	Complete pre-scan safety checklist. Start session on time.	Session appears in your calendar. Hospital sees assigned status.
Completion	Mark session complete. Add completion notes from template.	Hours auto-calculated from start/end. Added to CPD log. Logged to your hours total.
History	Review feedback. Rate the hospital.	Updates your hospital-specific rating. Feeds into future fit scores.

TOOLS FOR YOUR PRACTICE

The admin side — availability, hours, protocols

Beyond the live session flow, the Tools section handles everything that keeps your remote practice running — setting when you're available, tracking your hours across facilities, signing hospital SOPs, and sharing protocol notes with other radiographers on the network.

LIVE

Availability Blocks

Set windows when you're open to sessions: "Available", "Busy", or "Not available". Add as many blocks as you like. Availability is the 40-point factor in your fit score — the single biggest lever for getting matched.

LIVE

Calendar View

All your upcoming, active, and past sessions on a rolling calendar, colour-coded by modality. Click any session for full detail. Useful for spotting conflicts before they happen.

LIVE

Hours Tracker

Total hours worked, hours this month vs last, hours by facility, hours by modality. Recent sessions table with start/end times. Exportable — useful for self-employed accounting or umbrella returns.

LIVE

Hospital Protocols

Every hospital you work with may require SOPs signed before your first session there. Protocol status tracked per document per hospital, with signature timestamp and version history.

LIVE

Protocol Library

Community-contributed protocol notes across MRI, CT, PET-CT, PET-MRI. Filter by modality, scanner manufacturer, or model. Contribute your own notes and build reputation across the network.

LIVE

Profile & Credentials

Your HCPC (or SRK, CORU, equivalent) number, DBS or background check, indemnity insurance, registered modalities, scanner experience, and certifications. Edit any time. Expiry dates flagged before they lapse.

CPD LOG

HCPC revalidation that writes itself

HCPC requires 30 hours of CPD per two-year cycle, with evidence and reflection for a percentage of randomly-selected registrants. Most radiographers know this. Very few have the record in a state that would actually survive an audit on the day it's requested. Remote-I handles the majority of it automatically.

What gets captured automatically

WHAT YOU GET

Your credentials, your track record, your control

The biggest structural change Remote-I offers isn't any single feature — it's that everything produced by your work belongs to you. Your credentials, your ratings, your hours, your CPD record, and your scanner experience are all held in a profile you own. If you ever leave Remote-I, the record of what you've done doesn't disappear into an agency's CRM.

What changes when you work through Remote-I

"The radiographer is the one doing the clinical work. The record of that work should live with the radiographer — not in a third party's database that you pay 30% of your rate to access."

JOIN THE NETWORK

Register today — first session within days

Remote-I is open to qualified remote radiographers across the UK and Europe. Registration takes around 15 minutes. Once your profile is complete you enter the match pool and hospitals begin scoring you against their sessions — credential verification is done by each hospital's HR Manager or Lead Radiographer as part of approving you into their pool.

From sign-up to first session

**DAY 1
REGISTER****Create your profile**

Email, name, registration body (HCPC, SRK, CORU, or equivalent), and registration number. About 5 minutes. MFA set up at this step.

**DAY 1
CREDENTIALS****Upload documents**

Registration certificate, background check (DBS or equivalent), professional indemnity insurance. Add modalities, scanner experience, and certifications to raise your fit score.

**ONGOING
HOSPITAL
REVIEW****Hospitals verify and approve**

Each hospital's HR Manager or Lead Radiographer reviews your credentials and approves you into their pool. Approval is per-hospital — you can be approved by several in parallel, and you see the status of each on your dashboard.

**ONCE APPROVED
GET MATCHED****Start receiving requests**

The moment a hospital approves you, their open sessions run your fit score. Complete availability blocks raise that score meaningfully — a 95% profile gets notified noticeably earlier.
